

The Party III - Herning'93

Since the Light party in Alingsas 1992, I've never missed a major party. I've had an extremely good time at every party I've attended to, Light'92, Brutal'92, Aars'92 and TCC'93. Parties really is something special for me. They are the only opportunities for a scener to meet SO MANY contacts and friends for real, watching demos, copying lots of disks and simply MINGLE. I get delirious just thinking about it. And when I read about The Party III, I got bubbles in my stomach; I was going to visit this party, no matter what would happen. It was to be held between the 27th and 29th of December 1993 in a city called Herning, situated right in the heart of Denmark. The C64 organizers were Camelot, just like last year. According to the Amiga organizers Silents, Lemon and Spaceballs, this party would be the greatest party ever, with lots of nice competitions, performances and everything that is possible to make a computer freak happy. Boy, hadn't I heard this kind of bragging before? But since The Party II was quite a success, I believed them a little.

The transport to the party was, as a couple of times before, arranged by Spirou/FLT and Creeper/Antic, who'd fixed a bus straight from Stockholm to the partyplace, return journey included. They must be credited for this, because they make the trip so much easier (and funnier AND cheaper!) than going by train or car. We hope that they will continue with this in the future.

Unfortunately I live quite a bit away from Stockholm, so on 26th of December at 20.20 I jumped on the train that was going to take me there before 01.00, when the bus was going to leave. I brought with me the usual stuff, sleeping bag, change, pocket money (about 1400 SKR) and ofcourse my camera I also brought a small B/W TV, which was going to be used together with Exalt/Antic's Amiga 600. Sharing the burdens is much easier, you know.

When I arrived at Stockholm's central station there still was a couple of hours before "take off", so I chatted with some Amiga guys for a while. When they got to know that I was in Triad on the C64, they got really excited. They said that Triad was the cult group No1 for them on the C64 and that they so well remembered the times of Mr Z. Evidentially Triad is a very well known group for most of us, even if Triad nowadays practically can't be compared to the old group. But anyway, that was really a proof of how great Triad have been on C64.

After some minutes some C64 guys also turned up, like Motley and Scope of G*P, Riddler and Trasher of Active (who had been waiting in Stockholm for over 12 hours for the bus to arrive (on a Sunday!)), Pommac/Hoaxers, Bacchus and Vodka/FLT and ofcourse Spirou and Creeper. The bus (a double decker) allowed about 75 passengers and almost all of them joined in Stockholm. It was going to stop at strategic places and pick up more people on the

way to Gothenburg and the ferry from there, like Exalt, Depeh, and Zyron/Antic, Unifier/Spirit, King Fisher/Triad, Bappalander/Fairlight and some Jam'ers. After over 20 hours of none-stop travelling I finally could see the partyplace. The time was now 16.00 on the 27th of December. Since the party had been opened since 10.00, we were a little late. So now there was no time to lose.

The first impression I got of the "messecenter" was that it looked like a school or something. But when I got inside I only had one word for it: HUGE. Only the entrance hall was like a building itself. Anyway, there weren't many guys at the information desk, so checking in only took a few minutes. Quite a difference if you compare it to The Party II, where just checking in took about two hours..

After some minutes of running around in the corridors I finally entered the main party hall. It was really a wonderous sight, the hall was at least as big as a football ground, and it was almost full of people, computers and loud noise. The three elements of a party! I put my things among the Antic guys in a corner of the hall, picked up my camera and started to explore the halls.

The big screen for showing demos and such stuff was really big this year, and the sound system was also very good. The stage was just below the screen. I walked through the corridors again and after walking through the whole complex, I must say I was impressed. There were two restaurants, one that was open between 10.00 - 22.00 and one that was open 24 hours a day. They served hamburgers, spaghetti or just sandwiches. I also counted three kiosks and a stand where they sold diskettes and computer equipment. There was also a hall where different danish companies (including Commodore) had exhibitions and selling stands. A really great thing I also passed two halls full of computer freaks before reaching the sleeping halls. Like any other halls these were really huge, and would easily fit hundreds of tired sceners. All in all, the organisation was really a success so far, and the whole complex was perfectly suited for a party like this. Enormous areas everywhere and the whole building was probably new built, because the "design" of it was so modern. There was even a fountain in one of the halls! After some hours of walking around and chatting with contacts I and some local friends shared a bottle of "Jagermeister", that I had bought on the ferry. We had to put it in Coke bottles first to avoid getting thrown out (alcohol was forbidden at the partyplace). It tasted really great at the beginning, but after a while it was almost terrible, because it had turned warm. Yuck! So I gave up the idea of getting drunk and decided to take a nap instead.

The Party III - Herning'93

After some calculations I found out, that I'd been awake for over 43 hours, a personal RECORD! Knowing this made me even more tired, so I quickly rushed off to the sleeping halls. It was almost totally dark in here, so I had to walk carefully not to stumble over some sleeping bags. The most popular places to sleep was along the walls, and after some searching I found a place, an entrance with a closed door. Unfortunately this place was lightened up by a lamp in the roof (perhaps this was the reason why this place wasn't occupied!), but I was too tired to care. I went to sleep immediately. About seven hours later I woke up. The time was now about 11:00 on the 28th. The first thing I recognised was that there was a draught on the floor, and it had made me very cold. This is typical for a party, at almost every party I've attended, there has been COLD sleeping halls. A very bad and serious problem that must be improved in the future. Anyway, at the time I didn't care too much, but I decided not to sleep anymore in these halls.

After some hours the deadline for the C64 demo competition took place, and after yet some hours they showed the demos; Fairlight, Oxyron, Antic, Camelot, Censor, Dual Crew, Focus, Silicon Ltd, WoW and Spirit. Anyhow the quality of the demos were really high, especially the Censor, Camelot and Fairlight demos that were really outstanding. I have to admit that I didn't notice too much of the graphics and music competitions so I couldn't give any reactions on them until after the compos. Then it was time for the voting, and I have to say that the voting system used couldn't be more unpractical. When checking in everyone received an Amiga voting disk, that was to be handed in at the information counter after voting. Well, that system sucks in three ways.

1. They probably expect everyone to have an Amiga. If you don't you have to borrow one to be able to vote.

2. When you're voting, each demo, music and picture has a certain number that must be noticed when watching the competition on the screen. This involved several misunderstandings and mix-ups that were disastrous for the results!

3. It's so fucking easy to cheat the votes! For example a certain FLT member collected some 40 disks and voted for the FLT demo as No1 on every disk. But he made the mistake not taking paragraph 2 too seriously, so by accident he voted Focus as No1 instead of FLT. With other words, he gave Focus about 200 votes extra. He who diggeth a pit shall fall therein...

Here are the results of the C64 competitions:
DEMO: 1.Camelot, 2.Censor, 3.Focus, 4.Fairlight; 5.Oxyron, 6.Dual Crew, 7.Silicon Ltd.; 8.Antic/Spirit; 10.WoW.
GRAPHIC: 1.Oxydy/FLT, 2.Dane/Triad; 3.Deekay/Crest; 4.Mad/Padua, 5.Creaper/Antic
MUSIC: 1.Red Devil/FLT, 2.Kristian Rostoen;

3.Zyron/Antic; 4.Odyseus; 5.Amadeus/Meka Des.

These results certainly look strange, but what can you expect with this ROTTEN voting system. You shouldn't take them seriously at all. Just look!

* Hein Design and Mirage/Focus came on a 18th and 19th place respectively. This just COULDN'T have happened with a somewhat normal voting system.

* Antic came EIGHTH with "Beyond Imagination 2", one of their best demos ever, only beating WoW Normal, do you think?

* Both Oxydy and Red Devil/FLT won their categories. No offence against them, but doesn't that look a bit suspicious?

All in all, I hope now that the organizers have learned from this mistake and that NO party organizers will use this totally WORTHLESS voting system in the future.

Just after the competitions the chaos started. Everyone wanted to copy every demo available and they were just running around everywhere. I had an unusually hectic period, because I was hunting for Amiga demos aswell. Anyway, I endured it all. Suddenly there was almost no time left of the party and people started to pack their things and left. Soon the bus arrived and we waved the partyplace goodbye (well, we didn't, but it all sounds much nicer if I write it like that). The trip to Fredrikshavn, where the ferries leave from, was no problem as I slept all the time. Here we had a couple of hours to eat until the ferry was leaving for Sweden, so we (I, Depeh, Zyron, Exalt, Unifier, Bappalander, Bacchus, Spirou and Creeper) went to the traditional "Tonys Pizzas". But the servant was in a real bad mood this time, so we decided to eat somewhere else. Finally on the ferry we took a seat in the bar. We ordered in a beer, and another one, and another one... In short we had a lot of fun, and I took some real cool photos. The Antic guys tried to persuade me to rejoin them and eventually I said yes. Actually I've been on the verge of doing this ever since I joined Triad. I have absolutely nothing against Triad, but I made a quite bad decision when joining them, since almost all Antic guys are really good friends of mine, and I feel more comfortable being in this group. Yeah, back to the roots!

The rest of the trip is uninteresting, I slept almost all the way home, except for a few times when I woke up with a hangover. Finally at 13:00 on the 30th of December I barged into my home and just threw myself into the bed. My fifth party trip was over, and as summary I have to say that this was one of the better ones. I had a really good time all through, except for the C64 competitions. But otherwise the organisation was well worth the 2200 SKR I spent on the whole trip. If there is a The Party IV next year, I'll make sure to be there. Will you?

INTERVIEW!

Another issue, another interesting interview. This time I feel very happy to present you an interview with one of the most famous persons in this scene and one of the best swappers (the best?) around (and by the way another friend of mine) **Incubus** of Antic (inc). I hope you're going to enjoy it as much as I did.

MIK: Although you filled an Identity sheet and although I published it last issue. There may be one or two readers who don't know anything about you. Would you please introduce yourself?

INC: Well then, I'm just a normal swapper, at present in the group Antic. I'm 19 years of age (my birthday is 75.03.27), my height is 191 cm and my weight is 92 kilos. To continue with these really interesting facts, I can add that I have green eyes and brown hair. What more? Yeah, I wear glasses.

MIK: Well, you are one of the most famous guys in this scene nowadays. There was a time when everybody wished to swap with you! How did you made it to that reputation?

INC: Did I really? Nice to hear that! In that case, it can't really have been because of my number of contacts, since I at my very highest stage had about 150 contacts. That might sound a lot, but for "megaswapping" it's (or it WAS) a very normal amount. It's really very hard for myself to judge how good I have been as a swapper and why, you'd better ask my contacts about that. But I have a motto as a swapper and that is to not send out only a disk with a short note. I call that offending. I try to send them something extra, like stickers, photoalbums, long letters and such things that makes it a bit funnier to receive a send. I've got very fine reactions from my contacts for the photoalbums I use to make, perhaps this is a reason? I'd like to say, that I wasn't first with this kind of idea, I "took" it from Joker/Mayhem.

MIK: Sure! It is that kind of swapping which made you get so famous! You're probably the only one who did this in that size! Anyway, there are everywhere those rumours that you left the scene! This happened not only once but several times since you decided to reduce your number of contacts last year. Tell us what is truth and what is out of the realm of fables!

INC: This is nothing else than just fables. I never quit the C64 scene! In march last year I had to drop over 100 of my contacts due to problems with the swedish post. After that I didn't send out until august and I guess that's when these rumours started. I think it was a misunderstanding between me and the editors of Reformation that resulted in this rumour. They published it, and then other mags followed it up. I don't blame the Reformation editors for this, I blame the editors of the mags who followed it up, without knowing anything if it was true or not. And every mag editor should know that if you aren't really sure if a piece of news is true or not, it is a rumour! It's as simple as that! So instead of writing "Incubus left the C64 scene", you should write "Rumours say that Incubus has left the C64 scene". My career has really suffered because of this, cos many of my contacts have surely read about this and decided not to send to me anymore since they thought that I had left the scene. I'm sure that false rumours like these have more or less ended the careers of many

sceners. And the sad thing about it is, that it's so fucking simple to prevent it! So all magazine editors, think about this, and this scene will become even better.

MIK: I guess most of the so-called "news" are rumours. If all magazines would only publish news, which they know to be 100% true, they'd publish news about their own group. This is for sure a problem to all of us. You lately rejoined Antic?!? Is this true and if. Why did you do it?

INC: Yes, that's true. I rejoined them at the ferry back from The Party III in Denmark. The Antic guys made me drunk and then forced me to rejoin! To be honest, it was both because I wanted it myself and because the Antic members wanted me too. During the time I was in Antic (Nov 1991 to Jan 1993) I got to know these guys very well and this is the main reason for leaving Triad for Antic. The friendship in Antic is so much greater than other groups. I dare to say this though I've only been in three groups before.

MIK: So you left Triad because the Antic guys are close friends to you! This is just the way it should be! And anyway, Antic is nowadays at least at the same standard as Triad (in the legal scene). Why did you join Triad by the way?

INC: So why did I leave Antic? This is a question I can hardly answer myself. At the time (Jan93) Antic was in a period of total unactivity (hard to believe, eh?). And at the very same time I got a phonecall from Tranziie/Triad. He asked me to join them. This really put me into one of the hardest decisions of my career. I eventually decided to join Triad. Much because I was interested in trying something new, I wanted to know what it felt like being in another group. And also because Triad have been one of my greatest influences, ever since I was a 10-year-old, sitting in front of my TV playing Exploding Fist and Destroyer, both cracked by Mr Z. But after being in Triad for a couple of months, I didn't feel anything special. And I got more negative than positive reactions from my friends and contacts. They were surprised that I had left Antic, and they said that they somehow connect me to Antic. And to tell the truth, after that I just hoped for Depeh/Antic to ask me to rejoin them. I think you know the rest. I just want to say that Triad is a really great group and all that, and that this had happened no matter what group I'd have left Antic for. They're legends alright, but that can't be compared to real friendship!

MIK: This is just the reason for the existance of a few groups! Friendship I mean. I know personally three groups which still exist without producing anything, just because the members are close friends (well, Sunrise is at least the best example for this). And why not? Charts are nothing! Friendship is the only thing that counts! What is your opinion about friendship in the scene? Do you really think that friendship keeps this scene alive?

INTERVIEW!

INC: There's absolutely no question about it, friendship does it all. Not just in the scene, but in general. Well, just imagine a scene without friendship and you'll have the answer right before your eyes. It's one of the most obvious things there is. Everybody should think like this.

MIK: And what do you think about the so-called "elite" scene? They can be very arrogant, or am I wrong? And is this what you'd call "friendship which keeps the scene alive"? Especially the elite-cracking scene cares a shit about groups which aren't present on the boards for example.

INC: The word "elite" is so diffuse, that it shouldn't really be used. Everyone seems to have their own personal view of this word. But when you think about it, elite is the opposite of lame. A lamer is the "scenish" word for idiot, stupid or dumb. Or it can be used to describe someone who doesn't know as much about the scene and the computer world as someone might want him or her to do. A person who lacks computer experience. But I needn't tell you that, did I? So an elite scener is exactly the opposite of that. Are some elites arrogant? Noh, I don't think so. In that case they would be lammers! To be serious, the word elite should be erased from the scener dictionary, since, as I said earlier, everyone has his own personal view of what this word means and it surely causes a lot of misunderstandings when used. So all of you really cool guys out there, stop using this word!

MIK: I know that you don't take more 64 contacts. But what would you do if a guy would contact you with very old and very lame stuff. Would you reply him?

INC: Nowadays, I would. But in my times of "megaswapping" I never had time to answer, I had to concentrate on my contacts. At that time I could get contacted by up to five or six guys a day, you know. But I never write "100% reply" in my adverts for that matter, so no one could take for granted that I was going to reply. I don't care if the stuff from people is old and so on, I only count the personality of the guy I get contacted by.

MIK: Should the scene be handled like a serious business like it is nowadays? Or isn't this all to have some fun?

INC: Ofcourse, the scene is a hobby for us all, right? At least it is for me, and I don't take it that seriously. But for some, it has developed into a business, like the cracking scene for example. But since no one in the scene gets payed for what they do, it's all a hobby.

MIK: This is exactly what I meant! They don't get money, but they take themselves and their work so fucking serious like a business. I just can't understand that. Never! Just tell us your opinion about charts! Are they important for you? It surely makes you feel good to see you on No.1 spot in swapper category or am I wrong? But can charts ever be objective?

INC: The charts are something that gives a hint of which persons and groups are ranked highest at the moment. But no one can take them really seriously,

since they are never 100% objective. But ofcourse, it's always fun and inspiring to see yourself in the top of the charts. I remember the first time I found myself on No.1 spot (in the swappercharts ofcourse!) It was a real moment for me, knowing that I was appreciated by my contacts this much. I'll never forget that. After all, the charts are really important for the scene. If you appear in the charts many times, you get famous. It's as simple as that. And fame is something we're all sighting in vain for.

MIK: Strange eh? We're searching for fame. Something I also can't understand. Last question about the scene: What are your future plans? Is there anything you haven't reached yet?

INC: I think I've reached the peak of my career. I was on my very top just before I got caught by the post in march last year. Now I'm just settling down with my 50 contacts, having a nice time. I'm not aiming at anything at the moment but to stay in this scene and help it to be alive for as long as possible. It feels like I owe the scene this, after all it's done for me.

MIK: What are you doing all the day?

INC: At the moment I'm a student, with my last semester of the technical senior high school. A very tough education, which doesn't leave many hours left for computing. I go to school Monday-Friday and we have the usual subjects like maths, physics, swedish, history, religion and athletics. Beside these we also have the special subjects construction and production. There are MANY tests all the time. For example, yesterday we had a test in production, today we had one in swedish and tomorrow we have a construction test. Quite frustrating, but I'll manage. I THINK... I'll not continue my education any further, since I've gotten sick and tired of anything that has with school to do.

MIK: What are your plans in that direction...?

INC: Well, the employment in Sweden is really bad at this time, so there's not much chance of getting a job after school. But my father is one of the "bosses" at a local Ericsson factory, so he should be able to fix me a job there. This is one of the few companies that actually is rising, so things are looking great for me.

MIK: What are your hobbies beside the 64 and Amiga? Are you interested in any sports or are you even practicing some?

INC: I collect stamps and coins, though it was some time ago that I really was into this. Otherwise I use to do quite a lot of sports, like tennis, table tennis, bowling, volleyball and basketball. I'm not playing in any league or something, I'm just doing it for fun. Nowadays I've started going to a local gym, to increase my "physical fitness" (I do 95 kilos in "bench weightlifting"). I do a couple of hours every second day and it's good for me both mentally and physically.

INTERVIEW!

Tarnow'93 - Elysium + Ata Party

MIK: What kind of music do you listen to?

INC: I've been waiting for this question! I'm into the musical art form of symphony rock, a music style that was at its highest in the early stages of the 70's. It's based on pure musical skill and perfection. It can be described like this: "A complex and well arranged kind of rock music, where each musician/instrument is an indispensable piece of the entirety. No instrument is degraded as a rhythm instrument during a melody, but every instrumental efforts are working intimately together in the building of a musical piece." Sounds neat, eh? Anyway I'm really stuck into this kind of music. Artists like Yes, Genesis, Marillion, Pink Floyd, Camel, Mike Oldfield and King Crimson are my favorites. If you haven't heard many of these names I can't blame you. The music of today with its simple rhythms and sill texts is the exact opposite of symphony rock. Jesus Christ, I can make such music! I can only accept techno, rap and such music when I'm drunk...

MIK: Are you able to play an instrument?

INC: I wish I could play any, but I can't. I tried to learn to play the piano once, but it didn't work out.

MIK: You wrote once, that you are very shy when you're standing in front of girls. Well, this is something outstanding in this scene (to admit such things I mean). Most of the sceners try to pretend to be very cool in any way. They'd never grant something like that! So what is your relationship to girls? Do you have a girlfriend?

INC: Haha, so you remembered! It must have been years ago when I said that. Yes, it's true that I get very shy in front of girls. But this is really nothing special. I'm not alone with that problem. It's just that I'm one of the few to admit that. No, honestly enough, I have no girlfriend. YET.

MIK: This makes you very special in this scene and it may be a reason for your popularity. You are different to the normal sceners (not in a negative way of course). The most of us are not really honest concerning such things (read also page 10 for more). Lets get to one of my most-liked questions: If you'd be dropped on a lonely island and you could take three things with you. What would that be?

INC: A boat and two oars. To be serious, that'd be the fab-looking supermodel Christy Turlington (if you can call her a thing), a portable CD-player and a nice record with Marillion.

MIK: You are really into that music! Something very special: If you could be an animal... Which one would you like to be and why?

INC: A tricky one! I think I'd choose to be an eagle. I've always been interested in the wonder of flying freely in the air. What a dreamish feeling that must be.

MIK: Believe it or not: Almost everyone would like to be an eagle. Totally free, to be able to fly... Understandable. What is your political opinion? Do you have problems like fascism in Sweden?

INC: I'm not really into politics. It sure is important, but ooh so boring. We sure have fascism in Sweden too. We have several racial groups, like VAM ("White

Arian Resistance") and BSS ("Preserve Sweden Swedish"). They're into all sorts of weird actions against immigrants.

MIK: What do you think about the destruction of our environment?

INC: That's one of the most unpleasant problems there is. And what's REALLY scary about it is that you can't get the destroyed environment back! Every acre of rain forest that disappears, is gone forever! Every hole in the ozone layer is unrepairable and so on. We can't stop the destruction totally, but we can make it go slower than it is now by taking action. And that's started to happen now. People have started to realise that we can't go on like this forever.

MIK: The world seems to be on the wrong way! Can we stop this and save the earth before everything is destroyed?

INC: No, we can't. But we can make it go slower, as I said before. We must start sorting our garbage, buy non-polluting packages and things like that. If we don't take action now, our children and grandchildren will suffer in the future.

MIK: Phew. Very pessemistic point of view. Back to more unimportant things: What is the most important thing in this scene? What keeps it still alive?

INC: It's clearly the friendship as stated in an earlier question. The scene of today is much more vulnerable than it was some years ago, therefore it's important that we stick together the few of us that are left. And we have succeeded quite well with that, I think.

MIK: Have you ever be in trouble with the post or the cops?

INC: Yeah, I was sort of caught in march 1993. I'd been sending out with far too low postage for almost a year before that, so I wasn't surprised when it happened. They told me that if I do it again, they will tell it to the police. Not that I think they would do it, but I won't take the risk.

MIK: Do you have enemies in the scene?

INC: No, I haven't. But there are some guys in the scene that I think have the wrong attitude. I won't mention their names to avoid trouble.

MIK: That's all, I think. If you want to greet anybody, just do it now!

INC: I especially want to greet REMIX/CLIQUE, my best friend ever in this scene. Hope you're well! I also'd like to mention Stephen, Anarchy, PRI, Neotec, Nightshade, Amarok, D-Ram, Dense, Bordeaux, Black Widow, RCS, Baze, Syndrom, Joker, Riddler and ofcourse you Mike!

MIK: Well, hi then. Thanks a lot for this interview. Any last words?

INC: FUCK nazism, FUCK racism, FUCK fascism! Sorry for the bad language, but I got a bit exalted there.

MIK: See you...

INC: Well, bye then. Thanks for letting me be interviewed!

As I managed to write some words about a polish party, here I am and I will try to inform you about the things that you might be interested in. The latest winter party was held at the end of last year, some time passed already, but anyway everyone of you (probably?) did get some stuff released over there in Tarnow, so why not knowing how it was... funny or boring? 


