Statement of Limited Warranty

DEFINITIONS

The term "Machine" as used herein refers to machines and/or their features, model conversions, machine elements and accessories unless the context requires individual reference.

The terms "Machines" and "machines" are used in substitution for the terms "Products" and "products," respectively. Such latter terms appear in selected IBM agreements.

The term "failing machine" refers to machine or machine element requiring warranty service. The term "exchange machine" refers to a machine or machine element provided by IBM to the Customer under an Exchange Type of Service.

The term "programming" shall mean such programming as IBM may make generally available, without separate charge, for machines of the types ordered by the Customer.

WARRANTIES

Machines purchased from IBM under an agreement for purchase of IBM machines or from an IBM approved Remarketer, or an IBM Authorized Dealer, Distributor or Wholesaler will be 1) newly manufactured by or for IBM from new and serviceable used parts which are equivalent to new in performance in these Machines, 2) assembled by or for IBM from serviceable used parts, or 3) Machines which have been previously installed.

IBM warrants that on the Date of Installation each Machine will be in good working order and will conform to IBM's official published specifications which are available upon request.

The Warranty Period for each Machine commences on its Date of Installation.

Warranty service as described herein may be provided by IBM, an applicable IBM Authorized Dealer, or an IBM selected independent contractor, as indicated in the applicable Exhibit.

IBM will not provide warranty service hereunder for Machines or programming located outside the United States and Puerto Rico.

Service and Parts Warranty

Commencing on the Date of Installation of each machine, model upgrade and feature addition, and continuing for the duration of the Warranty Period, IBM agrees to provide the availability of warranty service at no additional charge except as set forth in this subsection or in the subsection entitled "Travel Expense," to keep the machines, model upgrades and feature additions in, or restore them to, good

working order. Warranty service will be provided by repairing the machines, model upgrades or feature additions or exchanging the machines under one of the Types of Service described in the subsection entitled "Types of Service." The specific Type of Service for each machine, model upgrade or feature addition will be indicated in the applicable Exhibit. Warranty options that provide alternate Types of Service are available for certain Machines under an IBM maintenance agreement.

It is the Customer's responsibility to determine when a machine or machine element requires warranty service. Before requesting warranty service, the Customer will perform any problem determination procedures provided by IBM, and if service is required, the Customer will follow the service request procedures by IBM.

When the Customer presents a failing machine to IBM under a Repair Type of Service, IBM will provide warranty service to restore the failing machine to good working order. Repair Types of Service include remedial maintenance and may include preventive maintenance based on the specific needs of individual machines as determined by IBM. Repair Types of Service may also include lubrication, adjustments and replacement of parts, all as deemed necessary by IBM. Parts, which may be used parts, will be furnished on an exchange basis, and the replaced parts become the property of IBM. When a failing machine is to be repaired under a Repair Type of Service, the Customer is responsible to remove or implement other safeguards to protect all programming, programs, data and removable storage media before such repair.

When the Customer presents a failing machine to IBM under an Exchange Type of Service, it becomes the property of IBM at the time of exchange. An exchange may not be new, but will be in good working order, and becomes the Customer's property at the time of exchange. IBM reserves the right to verify that warranty service for a failing machine is required prior to providing an exchange machine. When a failing machine is exchanged, the Customer will remove all programming, programs, data and removable storage media, and all non-IBM parts, options, alterations and attachments before such exchange. The Customer agrees that all such items not removed will be deemed to have been discarded by the Customer. The Customer will not present to IBM a failing machine for exchange which is defaced, altered or damaged beyond repair. (Repair is as described in

the preceding paragraph.) However, if upon inspection IBM determines it has received in exchange a failing machine in such condition, the exchange will be nullified and each party will return to the other the machine or machine element in its possession.

The Period of Warranty Service Availability for IBM On-Site Repair and IBM On-Site Exchange Types of Service are specified in the applicable Exhibit. Outside such Period, warranty service, if requested by the Customer and provided by IBM, will be subject to charge for travel expense plus travel, waiting and service time at IBM's then applicable hourly service rates and minimum charges; however, there will be no additional charges for parts.

The Period of Warranty Service Availability for Customer On-Site Exchange, Customer Carry-In Exchange and Customer Carry-In Repair Types of Service are specified in the applicable Exhibit.

Warranty service described herein does not assure uninterrupted operation of the Machines. IBM may, at its option, store on the Customer's premises maintenance equipment and/or parts that IBM deems necessary to fulfill this warranty.

During the Warranty Period, engineering changes, determined applicable by IBM, will be controlled by IBM and installed as specified by IBM on the Machines. The Customer may, by providing notice subject to written confirmation by IBM, elect to have only mandatory changes, as determined by IBM, installed on Machines so designated.

IBM shall have full, free and safe access to the Machines to provide IBM On-Site Types of Service thereon. The Customer shall promptly inform IBM of any change in a Machine's location during the Warranty Period.

In respect to warranty service provided by IBM, the Customer is responsible for all risk of loss of, or damage to, Machines owned by other than IBM during the period such Machines are in transit to and from IBM, except for loss or damage caused by IBM's negligence. However, IBM is responsible for risk of loss of, or damage to, Machines owned by other than IBM while in possession of IBM or in transit from IBM by an IBM selected carrier whose expenses were prepaid by IBM.

The Customer represents and warrants that, at the time a failing machine becomes IBM's property, it will be free of any outstanding liens, security interests or other encumbrances held by any third party.

If the Warranty Period expires on a Friday or Saturday, it will be extended so that the last day of

such Warranty Period will be on the following Sunday.

Types of Service

IBM On-Site Repair (IOR)

IBM will provide warranty service for the failing machine at the Customer's location.

IBM On-Site Exchange (IOE)

IBM will 1) deliver the exchange machine to the Customer's location, 2) disconnect the failing machine, 3) connect the exchange machine, 4) verify its operation, and 5) remove the failing machine from the Customer's location.

Customer On-Site Exchange (COE)

IBM will have an exchange machine delivered to the Customer's location. The Customer will 1) disconnect the failing machine and prepare it for shipment to IBM, 2) connect the exchange machine, and 3) verify its operation. The Customer will follow IBM's instructions regarding the shipment of the failing machine to IBM. Such shipment will be at IBM's expense.

Customer Carry-In Exchange (CCE)

The Customer will 1) deliver the failing machine to an IBM Service/Exchange Center or other IBM designated location, 2) pick up the exchange machine and take it to the Customer's location, 3) connect it, and 4) verify its operation.

The Customer, in lieu of such delivery and pick up, may ship the failing machine prepaid, in the original shipping container or equivalent to one of the designated IBM Service/Exchange Centers designated for this delivery method. IBM will then ship the exchange machine to the Customer's locations, prepaid, within the United States and Puerto Rico.

Customer Carry-In Repair (CCR)

The Customer will 1) deliver the failing machine to an IBM Service/Exchange Center or other IBM designated location, 2) when the failing machine is repaired, pick up and return it to the Customer's location, 3) connect it, and 4) verify its operation.

The Customer, in lieu of such delivery and pick up, may ship the failing machine prepaid, in the original shipping container or equivalent, to one of the IBM Service/Exchange Centers designated for this delivery method. IBM will ship the repaired machine to the Customer's location, prepaid, within the United States and Puerto Rico.

Programming

IBM warrants that, when shipped to the Customer, programming designated by IBM for use with a Machine and for which programming services are available will conform to IBM's official published specifications which are available upon request.

IBM does not warrant that functions contained in programming will operate in the combinations which may be selected for use by the Customer or will meet the Customer's requirements.

ALL OTHER PROGRAMMING IS DISTRIBUTED ON AN "AS IS" BASIS.

Additional Provisions for Features and Model Conversions

IBM's warranty for each feature addition or model upgrade requires that the machine on which it is installed is at the then current engineering-change level, is the specific serial-numbered machine for which it was ordered, and has been modified only with changes obtained from IBM specifically for that serial-numbered machine. If these conditions are not met, IBM will attempt to install non-Customer set-up feature additions and model upgrades on the machine, and, if such attempt results in an incorrectly functioning machine, upon Customer request and at IBM's then applicable hourly service rates and minimum charges, parts and material prices and travel expense, IBM will remove the features and/or model upgrades and restore the machine to its prior condition. If such features or model upgrades did not involve the removal of parts which became the property of IBM, such features and model upgrades remain the property of the Customer. If such features and model upgrades did involve the removal of parts which became the property of IBM, such features and model upgrades become the property of IBM and the restored parts become the property of the Customer.

For a feature removal, model downgrade or reinstallation of a previously purchased feature or model conversion, a three-month parts warranty will apply to additional parts, if any, supplied by IBM.

Additional Provisions for Accessories

Accessories have a three-month Warranty Period unless otherwise specified by IBM. During the Warranty Period, the Customer will remove any defective or failing accessory and ship it prepaid to the designated IBM location. IBM will replace such accessory and ship the replacement to the Customer without charge.

Additional Provisions for Machines Containing Funds

The Customer is responsible for removing, controlling and replacing or reloading funds contained in the Machines. IBM will service Machines containing funds only when the cash container cannot be opened prior to repair by IBM, in which case the Customer will remove the funds as soon as the container has been opened.

Services for Additional Charge During the Warranty Period

The services for additional charge described in this subsection are not warranty services. However, unless such services are provided under another written agreement between the Customer and IBM, during the Warranty Period, the following services, if available, will be provided by IBM to the Customer at IBM's i) then generally available hourly service rates and minimum charges for IBM service time, including travel and waiting time, ii) parts and material prices then generally in effect, and iii) charges for travel and shipping expense, all as applicable:

- 1) Repair of Machine damage, replacement of parts or increase in service time caused by —
 - a) failure to continually provide a suitable environment prescribed by IBM including adequate space, electrical power, air conditioning and humidity control;
 - b) neglect misuse, including use of the Machines for purposes other than for which designed;
 - c) accident disaster, including water, wind and lightning, transportation; vandalism or burglary;
 - d) alterations, including any interconnection to the Machine of non-IBM equipment or devices not under an IBM maintenance agreement;
 - e) attachments, including any interconnection to the Machine design;
 - f) IBM Machines, other Machines or accessories, except those IBM Machines, other Machines or accessories that are owned by IBM, under warranty from IBM or under an IBM maintenance agreement;
 - g) conversions from one IBM model to another or installation or removal of an IBM feature whenever any of these activities was performed by other than IBM, except that this item (g) will apply only during the first three-month period subsequent to such Machine modification; and

- h) maintenance or repair of the Machine not performed by IBM.
- 2) Repair of Machine damage, replacement of maintenance parts (due to other than normal wear) or repetitive service calls caused by the use of, or failure to use, supplies;
- 3) Service for accessories other than as provided in the subsection entitled "Additional Provisions for Accessories" of this Section;
- 4) Inspection of altered Machine;
- 5) Replacement or addition of parts and increase in service time associated with the installation by IBM of an engineering change, required due to the conversion of one IBM model to another or installation or removal of an IBM feature whenever any of these activities was performed by other than IBM;
- 6) Rearrangement or relocation of Machines and provision of necessary materials; and
- 7) Replacement of a part not furnished for the Machine by IBM with a directly interchangeable IBM maintenance part, and any increase in service time associated with such activity, except that IBM will not replace any part which is included in an alteration.

Travel Expense

There will be no charge for travel expense associated with warranty service or programming service during the applicable Period of Warranty Service Availability except that actual travel expense will be charged when the site at which the Machine is located is normally inaccessible by both private automobile and scheduled public transportation.

Exclusions

The warranties stated herein do not include 1) furnishing supplies, painting or refinishing the Machines or furnishing material therefore, 2) electrical work external to the Machines, 3) installation, maintenance or removal of alterations or attachments to the Machines, and 4) any service which is impractical for IBM to render because of alterations in, or attachments to the Machines. IBM does not warrant that the operation of Machines or programming will be interrupted or error free or that all programming errors will be corrected.

THE FOREGOING WARRANTIES ARE IN LIEU OF ALL OTHER WARRANTIES, EXPRESS OR IMPLIED, INCLUDING, BUT NOT LIMITED TO THE IMPLIED WARRANTIES OF MERCHANTABILITY AND FITNESS FOR A PARTICULAR PURPOSE.

Preface

This manual describes the setup and the operations of the IBM InfoWindow 3477 and its intended use is for operators and supervisors.

Note: Some display station parts or equipment that appear in this publication may not be available in your country. Ask your IBM marketing representative for details.

Organization

This manual has the following chapters and appendices:

Chapter 1, "Setup Instructions" provides information for initial setup of the display station. This chapter should also be referred to when a display station element is replaced.

Chapter 2, "Operations" describes operations and adjustments of the display station including print operations.

Chapter 3, "Display Screen and Operator Messages" describes the meanings of the symbols and messages that appear on the screen.

Chapter 4, "Keyboard and Key Functions" describes the functions of the keys, and shows the keyboard layouts available for the display station.

Chapter 5, "Problem Solving Guide" describes what to do when you have a problem during display station operations. This chapter also provides information for removing and packing the display station parts.

Appendix A, "Display Station Controls and Adjustments" provides information for controlling and adjusting the display station.

Appendix B, "Printer Controls and Adjustments" provides information for controlling and adjusting the printer.

Appendix C, "Country-Specific Keyboard Layouts" shows the country-specific keyboard layouts for the 122/124-key typewriter keyboards and the IBM Enhanced keyboards.

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Chapter 1. Setup Instructions

This chapter describes how to set up your display station and the ASCII printer (optional). Perform all activities as shown in the following instructions.

If you have any problem in setting up the display station, see Chapter 5, "Problem Solving Guide" on page 5-1.

Note: Packing material is required for shipment if you relocate or require service on the display station. New packing material can be purchased from IBM if needed.

DANGER

To avoid shock hazard:

- The power cord must be connected to a properly wired and grounded receptacle.
- Any equipment to which this product will be attached must also be connected to properly wired receptacles.
- Any cables should not be connected or disconnected during an electrical storm.
- Installation, maintenance, or reconfiguration of this product should not be performed during an electrical storm.

CAUTION

When the logic element requires disposal, do not handle it as normal trash, because the logic element contains a lithium battery (3 V, 500 mAh, UL¹ recognized component or equivalent). The lithium battery contains less than 150 mg of lithium and can be harmful to people and may explode if not properly used, handled, or disposed of, such as; (1) thrown into water, (2) overheated to more than 100°C (212°F), or (3) attempting to recharge, repair, or disassemble. When disposing of the logic element, follow your company's safety procedures or local procedures, which define the disposal of such items.









- 5 While holding the top edge of the front side of the display element, pull the logic element toward you until the logic element snaps into place.


















- 1 The lift-stand tension is pre-set for either monochrome or color display models. Make sure that you have the correct lift-stand for your display.

- 2 Lock the lock-lever of the lift-stand.




- 3 Locate the six slots **3** of the display element.






- 5 Insert the six hooks of the lift-stand into the six slots of the display element and place the stand on the display element. You should hear a click sound when the stand is locked onto the display element.

- 7 Make sure that the notch at the bottom of the stand is indicating the front of the display element. Then turn the display element right side up.






Lock Lever Release




Adjust the height and viewing angle of the display element.







If it becomes necessary to change the power cord or plug, or if the outlet is incorrectly wired, have the change made by a qualified electrician according to local or national code. A new power cord may be ordered from your IBM marketing representative.



Chapter 2. Operations

This chapter describes control and adjustments of the 3477 and also introduces various functions available for the 3477.

The display station can attach any of the following two keyboard elements.

- **122/124-key typewriter keyboard** (124-key for Japanese Katakana and 122-key for the U.S. English and other national languages)
- **IBM Enhanced keyboard** (102-key for the U.S. English, 103-key for the languages other than the U.S. English., 104-key for Japanese Katakana)

Your display station can attach to any of the following IBM PC printers. It can also be used as a system controlled printer or a local screen printer, depending on the terminal mode (one-display, two-display, or display-printer terminal mode).

Powering-On

The following steps show how to start the 3477 operation.

1. Turn the security key **1** clockwise to unlock the keyboard.

The security lock prevents the entry, changing, or viewing of the display station's data.

2. Set the power switch **2** to On (I) or the power button to flat position.

This switch applies power to the display station, and the Power-on light **3** illuminates.

When you turn on the display station, function tests are run. If any problems are detected, an error code appears on the operating status line (bottom line of the screen) or an alarm sounds.

Note: A quick power off/on sequence may cause problems with the display station. After powering off, wait a few seconds before powering on again.




Figure 2-1. IBM InfoWindow 3477

Personalizing Display Station

This section describes how to adjust the brightness and contrast of the screen, display viewing angle, and keyboard slope.

Screen Brightness

This control knob adjusts the character brightness on the screen. The characters become brighter as you turn this knob to the right.





Figure 2-2. Brightness Control

This control knob adjusts the contrast between the intensified characters or fields and the normal ones on monochrome display stations.




Figure 2-3. Contrast Control

You can adjust the viewing angle by rotating and tilting the display element.





Figure 2-4. Viewing Angle Adjustment


When you adjust the height of the display element, be careful not to pinch your fingers.

Keyboard Slope Adjustment

You can adjust the keyboard slope by:

1. Lifting the back of the keyboard.
2. Pulling out the leg edges from the keyboard.
3. Pushing out the legs to lock them in place.

When you flip both legs up from the underside of the keyboard, the keyboard sits flat.



What the 3477 Can Do

The 3477 is a display workstation consisting of three elements: display, logic and the keyboard. It can be attached locally to the AS/400, System/36, or System/38 by a twinaxial cable, the IBM Cabling System, or telephone twisted-pair cabling. The 3477 can also be connected to the IBM 5294/5394 Remote Control Units for remote usage via telecommunication lines. The 3477 can also be attached to the 5259 Migration Data Link.

The 3477 comes in three models: 14 inch monochrome, 14 inch color, and 15 inch monochrome. There are three types of display formats: 24 lines x 80 characters (1920 characters), 27 lines x 132 characters (3564 characters), and 42 lines x 80 characters (3360 characters for split screen format).

Either of the following two keyboards can be attached to the 3477:

- 122/124-key typewriter keyboard
- IBM Enhanced keyboard.

Operational Modes

The 3477 operates in six: communication, setup, setup printer, record, play, and test mode.

Communication Mode

In this mode, the 3477 can communicate with a host system.

Setup Modes

The 3477 has two setup sub-modes: offline and online. From the screen panels, the 3477 can be customized by selecting setup values/parameters that best suit your operation.

In offline setup mode, the following parameters can be selected through the "Customization" or "Serial Number" panel.

- Terminal mode
- Display address 1
- Display address 2
- Character Set
- Printer address
- Printer character set
- Printer emulation
- Keyboard type and keyboard ID
- Serial number.

In online setup mode, the following functions can be selected through the "Setup Display" panels.

- Alarm Volume
- Clicker Action
- Clicker Volume
- Cursor Style
- Cursor Blink
- Row/column indicator
- Rule line:

- Style
- Intensified or Color
- Follow cursor
- Auto dim and delay time
- Extended display
- Reverse image (black-on-white only)

For a detailed description on customization setup values/parameters, refer to Appendix A, “Display Station Controls and Adjustments” on page A-1.

Setup Printer Mode

If a printer is attached to the 3477, the user can define the setup values/parameters through the “Setup Printer” panels.

With the “Setup Printer” panels, the following functions can be selected.

- Lines pitch (lines per inch)
- Character pitch (characters per inch)
- Print quality (printed character quality)
- Character width (standard or double width)
- Character height (standard or double height)
- Print key (define characteristics of the Print key)
- Trim border (treatment of a trimming frame)
- Type style, System code page, and Attention(for 5219 emulation only)
- Paper feed, Form, and Source drawer (for 5219 emulation only)

For a detailed description about setup values/parameters for the “Setup Printer” panels, refer to Appendix B, “Printer Controls and Adjustments” on page B-1.

Record Mode

Pressing the Record key in communication mode causes the display station to enter record mode. Data which is required on a regular basis can be recorded in any of the 24 Function (F) keys. The maximum keystrokes that can be recorded are 1500. Refer to “Recording and Playing Keystrokes” on page 2-17.

Play Mode

After the data is recorded, it can be retrieved in communication mode and displayed by pressing the Play key and then the assigned F key. Refer to “Recording and Playing Keystrokes” on page 2-17.

Test Mode

There are two test sub-modes: basic assurance and offline. When the 3477 power switch is turned on, it automatically enters the basic assurance test mode. The self diagnostic programs test the hardware functions. In offline test mode, additional tests can be selected and run. Refer to Chapter 5, “Problem Solving Guide” on page 5-1.

Field Attributes

Field attributes determine how the data will be displayed. The attribute is specified by the bit settings found at the beginning of the field. If extended display is enabled from the “Online Setup” panel, the current assignment is displayed in hexadecimal at the attribute position.

Cursors

Two types of cursors are available: normal and shadow.

Normal Cursor

The normal cursor indicates the position where the next character entered will be placed.

Two styles of cursors are available: underline and block. The operator can select the style of cursor during online setup. From the same "Online Setup" panel or from the host system, the cursor can be made to blink; thereby making it easier to find the cursor.

Shadow Cursor

The shadow cursor (a block type cursor) is a secondary cursor. It moves horizontally on a parallel line with the normal cursor. This allows the operator to easily determine the column location of the normal cursor.

The shadow cursor is set on or off by request of the host system.

The line on which the shadow cursor moves is specified by the host system. The line can be in the data area or the message line.

Rule Line

The rule line is used to determine the cursor position relative to other characters displayed on the screen. The user can select one of three rule lines: horizontal (-), vertical (|), or cross (+) through the "Setup Display" panels.

The indication of the rule line can also be specified as follows:

- Color of the rule line (for color models): white or green
- Highlight of the rule line (for monochrome models): high intensity or normal
- Follow cursor (a rule line to be moved with a cursor): yes or no

The rule line can be displayed or not by pressing the Rule key.

Row/column Indicator

The row/column indicator in the operating-status line shows the number at which the cursor is currently located.

The user can set the row/column indicator on or off during online setup.

Character Set

The 3477 supports two character sets: Country specific and Multinational. Either character set can be specified during offline setup.

Country Specific Character Set

When the "country specific character set" is specified, the code pages and the graphic character sets can be used according to the attached keyboard language.

Multinational Character Set

When the “Multinational character set” is specified, the common international character set can be used.

Extended Display

When the extended display function is enabled, the field attributes are in hexadecimal format. The display positions that contain code points of neither characters nor field attributes are displayed as small dots.

The controller and keyboard link parity error counts are also displayed on the operating-status line.

The extended display function is enabled or disabled during online setup.

Auto Display Dim

The auto display dim function blanks the data area and the message line if the pre-defined interval of time expires without any key operation.

When auto dim is on, the symbol (⌘) is displayed on the operating-status line. The other symbols on the operating-status line are not affected by the auto display dim function.

The operator can set the auto dim function on or off during online setup. The dim interval can be set for 5, 10, or 20 minutes.

The blanked screen is restored when the host communication is resumed or a key is pressed.

Security Key lock

A security key lock is provided to prevent unauthorized use of the display station.

When locked, the screen is blanked, an ⌘ followed by the key symbol appears on the status line and the keyboard is disabled.

Audible Alarm

The audible alarm is used to attract the operator's attention.

The alarm volume can be adjusted during online setup to one of six sound levels: Off, 1, 2, 3, 4, or High.

Clicker

The clicker sound notifies the operator that the keystroke is accepted.

During online setup, the operator can set the clicker on or off. When the operator selects "Yes" (for on), the clicker sounds each time a key is pressed and the key entry data is accepted. If the data is not accepted, there will be no audible feedback. When "No" (for off) is selected, the operation will be just the opposite of "Yes".

The operator can also set the clicker volume during online setup to one of six levels: Off, 1, 2, 3, 4, or High.

Reverse Image

Monochrome models displays dark characters on light background or light characters on dark background.

The reverse image function varies according to the models.

Green and Amber-gold models: The host system can reverse the screen image by sending a request to the 3477. The 3477 user cannot directly use this function.

Black-on-white model: The 3477 user can reverse the screen image any time through online setup panels. The host system cannot reverse the screen image by sending a request.

Languages on Setup Panels

The 3477 characteristics can be selected during the setup functions. The setup operation is performed by selecting panels. The panels display one of five languages, as shown in the following table, and correspond to the the attached keyboard language.

Characters in Diacritic Mode

The 3477 can produce characters with special accent symbols. When any accent symbol keys are pressed, the 3477 enters diacritic mode and a ð appears on the operating status line. The cursor does not move, but the corresponding scan code is transmitted to the host system. If the next accent character pressed is valid, the accent character is displayed at the cursor position and the cursor is advanced.

The diacritic mode is a function of the host system application program and not the 3477. Contact your system coordinator or see the system program manual for more information on how to use the diacritic mode.

Dual Addresses Display Station Operation

This function allows simultaneous usage of two independent logical display stations. The workstation controller, or the host system, can communicate with the two logical display stations as if two physically separated display stations were attached.


The dual address display function can be used by selecting the “Two-Display” terminal mode in the 3477 customization (refer to Appendix A, “Display Station Controls and Adjustments” on page A-1 for details).

The following sections describe the screen formats for non-split screen and split screen.


Screen Format

In “Two-Display” terminal mode, one of the following two formats can be selected using the Zoom (⏏↔⏏) key.

- Non-split screen (either 24 lines x 80 characters or 27 lines x 132 characters defined by the host system)
- Split screen (42 lines x 80 characters).



Non-split screen format




Split screen format

Non-split Screen Operation

When the user selects the “Two-Display” terminal mode, either a 24 x 80 screen or a 27 x 132 screen for the logical display station 1 will be displayed.

If you want to communicate with the host system using the logical display station 2, press the Jump key together with the Alt key. The screen for logical display station 2 replaces logical display station 1.

Pressing the Jump key together with the Alt key changes the screen from display station 1 to display station 2 or from display station 2 to display station 1.



Note: In split screen operation, the user can only use a block cursor for the active screen.

Split Screen Operation

On the split screen, one half is active at a time. The active screen always has the cursor. The user can use the active screen for communications while data on the non-active screen can be referenced.

The user can do the following using the split screen:


- Changing the active screen
- Scrolling the lower half screen (small screen)
- Changing the screen format.

Changing the Active Screen

As mentioned previously, the active screen displays the cursor. If the user wants to change the active screen from the upper half screen (display station 1) to the lower half screen (display station 2) or from the lower half screen to the upper half screen, press the Jump key. The user can toggle back by pressing the Jump key again.

Notes:

1. In split screen, if the host system specifies the 27 x 132 screen format for the active screen, your display screen automatically changes from split screen to non-split screen and the host specified screen format will be displayed on the screen. In the same condition, if the host system specifies the same screen format for the active screen, the 24 x 80 screen format will be displayed.
2. When either the upper half screen or the lower half screen is active, the host system can establish a session with each split screen (logical display station).



Scrolling the Small Screen

When the cursor is in the upper half screen, scrolling of the lower half screen (small screen) is enabled. If the operator wants to scroll up the small screen, press the Back key. To scroll down, press the Fwd key.

The small screen displays only a part (18 x 80) of the entire screen (24 x 80).

Changing the Screen Format

When the operator wants to change the current screen format from the non-split screen to the split screen, or from the split screen to the non-split screen, press the Zoom (↔) key.

The cursor in split screen will move to the corresponding non-split screen location. For example, if the screen is split and the cursor is located on the lower half screen (small screen), pressing the Zoom key changes the screen from a split screen to the display station 2 full screen.

Note: When one of the non-split screens (either logical display station 1 or 2) is in 27 x 132 screen format, pressing the Zoom key causes an error and the error code, 9032 is displayed on the operating status line.

Browsing the Current Setup Values/Parameters for the 3477

The operator can check the current setting of the following display setup values/parameters through the browse display functions.

- Terminal mode
- Display address 1
- Display address 2
- Character set
- Keyboard type
- Keyboard ID

To browse the current setup values/parameters, do the following procedure.

1. Press the Setup key. The following online setup panel appears on the screen.


Recording and Playing Keystrokes

The Record/Play functions allow you to store and retrieve and display data with a single key entry. The Record/Play functions eliminate repetitive operations. Instead of keying in³ the same data, the display station can store the data and recall it anytime by pressing a single key. The data remains in storage even if you turn off the display station.⁴

Notes:

1. The local function keys cannot be recorded.
2. If the recorded data is played back, and there is an input-inhibit condition, the play back operation will be automatically terminated.
3. The record/play functions are not available if the operator sets the record/play function disabled by using "Record/Play Security Option". For detailed information, refer to "Record/Play Security Options" on page A-10.

The following figure shows the Record-ID (F1 - F24) keys that key strokes can be assigned to.







“RECRD,” a number (from 0 through 1500), and the Record ID Assignment indicator will be displayed in the operating status line in reverse video.

The Record ID Assignment indicator is used to show that you have already assigned and recorded data to the that F key. The assigned F key position is shown as a solid box. The number represents the remaining keystrokes available.



2. Press any F key where you want to record the data. The three previous indicators will be replaced with the following.



Note: If you select an F key where data is already recorded, the data will be replaced with the newly recorded data.

3. Key in data you want to record.

Notes:

a. You can also record a keystroke for the "Pause" key. When you first press the Pause key while in record mode, a Record/Play Halt indicator (⌘ ^) appears next to the "R" symbol.


Pause enables you to stop the record operation.

b. You can cancel the newly recorded keystrokes by pressing the Quit key (the Reset key plus an Alt key). This cancellation does not affect the previously recorded keystrokes.

4. Press the Recrd key to accept the recorded keystrokes. Return to the previous operation.




To play back the recorded key strokes:

1. Position the cursor at the location where you want the recorded data to begin.
2. Press the Play key on the 122/124-key typewriter keyboard (or F5/F17 key while pressing and holding the Alt key for the IBM Enhanced keyboard).

"PLAY" and the Record ID Assignment indicator will be displayed on the operating-status line in reverse video.



3. Press the same F key used to record the data. The two symbols shown in the previous step will disappear and an uppercase "P" will appear. The keystrokes will automatically play back starting at the cursor location. When the playback is complete, the "P" disappears.



Notes:

1. If you record the Pause, the playback action temporarily stops there. At the pause, you can key in additional data and the cursor moves as many positions as the data recorded. Pressing the Play key again continues the playback action from where you stop keying in data.
2. If you record long sentences for a single F key, and want to cancel during the playback operation, use the "Quit" key.





3. The data within the trimming area can be printed. If you want to change the trimming area, move the Trim Marker (box cursor at upper left corner) using the cursor move keys. If the cursor is moved to the right, the width gets smaller. If the cursor is moved downward, the depth gets smaller.

If you want to move the Trim Marker from the upper left corner to the lower right corner, press the F14 key.

4. When you complete the trimming area definition and want to print the data, press the Enter key. The attached printer starts to print. While the data is printing, the (local print status indicator) is indicated on the operating status line. When printing is complete, the indicator will change to .

The partial screen data printing is now complete.

System Screen Data Print

Assumption: You have data displayed that is ready to be printed. You want to use the system designated printer.

Note: The function of the Print key can be defined by the host application program.

Remember to pre-select the “System” parameter in the “Print key” on the Setup Printer panel.

1. Press the Print key. The 3477 sends a screen print request to the host system.
2. The system designated printer will start printing.

The system screen data printing is now completed.

If the font cartridge on the attached printer is pluggable and does not include the “087 Letter Gothic”, change the cartridge to the one that has “087 Letter Gothic” and then press the F2 key. The print operation with the type style will start. If the requested cartridge is not available, press the F2 key to ignore the host request.

For detailed information on how to change the type style, system code page, paper feed mechanism, form type, or source drawer type, refer to the Guide to Operation for the attached printer.

- b. If you do not want the print operation to be suspended by the host system, select “No” for attention setup parameter. Refer to “Summary of Printer Setup Parameters” in Appendix B.
 - c. If the printer is printing data when it receives a request for changing the type style, system code page, paper feed mechanism, form type, or source drawer, the data transmission from the 3477 to the printer will immediately suspended but the printer may continue printing data stored in the printer buffer.
3. After checking the printer setup values/parameters, press the Setup key for the 122/124-key keyboard (the Setup key plus the Shift key for the IBM Enhanced keyboard) to return to communication mode.

Chapter 3. Display Screen and Operator Messages

This chapter describes three different display screens available and various symbol and error code meanings.

Display Screen

The display screen is divided into two basic areas: the data area and the message area.

The data area displays data received either from your keyboard or the host system. The data area can display up to **1920 characters** (24 lines of 80 characters), **3564 characters** (27 lines of 132 characters) or **3360 characters** (42 lines of 80 characters). Format selection depends on the terminal mode or the host application programs. For additional terminal mode details, refer to Appendix A, "Display Station Controls and Adjustments" on page A-1.

The message area is divided into two sub-areas: the message line and the operating status line. The message line is an area to display error messages and help messages received from the host or the controller. Detailed information about error messages is described later in this chapter.

The area below the separator line is the operating status line. This is used to display your display station or attached printer operating status. The messages or the symbols displayed on this line are described in the following section.




Figure 3-1. 1920 Character Screen Format

Figure 3-1 shows the standard format (1920 characters) of your display station. The 24th line is used for either the message line or the data area, and the 25th line is the operating status line.




Figure 3-2. 3564 Character Screen Format

Figure 3-2 shows the condensed screen format (3564 characters). The 27th line is used for the message line, and the 28th line is the operating status line.




Figure 3-3. 3360 Characters Screen Format

Figure 3-3 shows the split screen format (3360 characters). This consists of two data areas: one from logical display station 1, and the other from logical display station 2. The 24th and 43rd lines are used for either the message lines or the data area, and the 44th line is the operating status line.

Operator Messages

This section describes the meaning of the various operator messages and symbols that appear during communication mode, setup mode, record/play mode and print mode.

The 3477 displays the various symbols and messages on either the operating status line or the data area to indicate:

- Display station operational status
- Functions selected
- Operational errors or machine failures detected by your display station or the host system.


The following sections describe the locations and meanings of the symbols that appear on the operating status line and the error codes and error recovery instructions that appear in the data area.

Symbols on the Operating Status Line

The symbols displayed on the operating status line vary depending on the operational modes: communication, setup, record/play, and print. The following sections describe the symbols location and meanings.

Symbols in Communication Mode

The communication mode symbols displayed on the operating status line are shown in Figure 3-4.



Note: If you select the one-display or display-printer mode, the Message Waiting 2 symbol does not appear.




Figure 3-5. Operating Status Line Symbols in Setup Mode




Figure 3-6. Operating Status Line Symbols in Record Mode




Figure 3-7. Operating Status Line Symbols in Enter-key state in Record Mode




Figure 3-8. Operating Status Line Symbols in Halt Record or Play Mode




Figure 3-9. Operating Status Line Symbols in Play Mode




Figure 3-10. Operating Status Line Symbols in Play Back Operation




Figure 3-11. Operating Status Line Symbols in Print (Screen) Mode




Figure 3-12. Operating Status Line Symbols in Print (Trim) Mode




Error Codes and Recovery Procedures

The 3477 is checked either by the host system or the built-in self-diagnostic program. This occurs during communication mode or when the power switch is set to On. The error codes can appear in three different positions on the display screen, depending on the nature of the problem.

The following two figures are the screen formats for non-split screen and split screen to indicate the locations where the error codes appear.

Error codes appearing in positions A and B are from the host system. If an error code appears in B, pressing the Help key will provide more error information and give the necessary recovery action.

Error codes 90xx, L, K, and LK that appear at position C on the operating status line, are controlled by the IBM 3477. Error codes L, K, and LK are used to isolate a failing element. For more details about isolation procedures, refer to Chapter 5, "Problem Solving Guide" on page 5-1 in this manual.

The following figures list and explain all error codes, causes, and recovery actions.

00xx (Error Codes Appearing at Position A or B)




Figure 4-1. 122-key Typewriter Keyboard Layout (U.S. English)




Figure 4-2. IBM Enhanced Keyboard Layout (U.S. English)





Some keys have a combination of characters, symbols, and labels printed on their key-top. To enter the one on the lower half, press the key alone. To enter the upper half, press and hold the upper shift (⇧) key then press the desired key.



Appendix A. Display Station Controls and Adjustments

Appendix B. Printer Controls and Adjustments




Figure C-1. Austrian/German 122-key Typewriter Keyboard




Figure C-2. Austrian/German IBM Enhanced Keyboard




Figure C-3. Belgian 122-key Typewriter Keyboard




Figure C-4. Belgian IBM Enhanced Keyboard





Figure C-5. Canadian French 122-key Typewriter Keyboard




Figure C-6. Canadian French IBM Enhanced Keyboard





Figure C-7. Danish 122-key Typewriter Keyboard




Figure C-8. Danish IBM Enhanced Keyboard




Figure C-9. Dutch IBM Enhanced Keyboard




Figure C-10. Finnish/Swedish 122-key Typewriter Keyboard




Figure C-11. Finnish/Swedish IBM Enhanced Keyboard





Figure C-12. French (AZERTY) 122-key Typewriter Keyboard




Figure C-13. French (AZERTY) IBM Enhanced Keyboard




Figure C-14. Italian 122-key Typewriter Keyboard




Figure C-15. Italian IBM Enhanced Keyboard




Figure C-18. Norwegian 122-key Typewriter Keyboard




Figure C-19. Norwegian IBM Enhanced Keyboard




Figure C-20. Portuguese 122-key Typewriter Keyboard




Figure C-21. Portuguese IBM Enhanced Keyboard





Figure C-22. Spanish 122-key Typewriter Keyboard




Figure C-23. Spanish IBM Enhanced Keyboard




Figure C-24. Spanish-Speaking 122-key Typewriter Keyboard




Figure C-25. Spanish-Speaking IBM Enhanced Keyboard




Figure C-26. Swiss-Bilingual-French 122-key Typewriter Keyboard




Figure C-27. Swiss-Bilingual-French IBM Enhanced Keyboard





Figure C-28. Swiss-Bilingual-German 122-key Typewriter Keyboard




Figure C-29. Swiss-Bilingual-German IBM Enhanced Keyboard




Figure C-30. U.K. English 122-key Typewriter Keyboard




Figure C-31. U.K. English IBM Enhanced Keyboard

Glossary

This glossary defines terms and abbreviations in this manual. If you do not find the term you are looking for, refer to the Index or to the *Dictionary of Computing*, SC20-1699.

A

address. The 3477 Display Station does not have address switches. Instead, the address is set using the offline setup panel.

attribute. A characteristic. For example, attributes of a displayed field could include brightness and reverse video.

audible alarm. An alarm that is sounded when designated events occur that require operator attention or intervention.

B

blank character. A character that is not displayed but occupies a position on the display screen.

C

cable-thru. A special feature or standard function that allows the attachment of multiple workstations to the same host system through a single cable path.

CECP. Country extended code page.

character location. A location on the display screen at which one character can be displayed.

clicker. A mechanism that sounds when a key is pressed.

command. An instruction that directs the system to perform an operation.

communication cable. A cable that carries commands and data between the host system and the display stations or printers.

control unit. A device used to coordinate and control operations of one or more attached workstations and to synchronize their operation with that of the host system.

controller. See *control unit* or *workstation controller*.

country extended code page (CECP). An eight-bit code page that has a 93-character set on its nationally standardized code points but is extended to the multilingual

character set for the national languages of some European countries.

cursor. A movable marker on the display screen that may appear as an underscore or as a rectangular block. The cursor indicates where the next character entered from the keyboard will appear.

D

display. The visual information on the screen.

display field. See *field*.

display screen. An electronic vacuum tube, similar to a TV display tube, used to display characters.

display station. An input/output device containing a display screen and an attached keyboard.

display station operator. A person who uses the keyboard to perform operations at a display station.

display system. The group of display stations and printers that are attached to a system.

F

field. One or more consecutive positions on the display screen set aside to contain a specific type of data; for example, a name or telephone number.

formatted display. A display screen with fields established for specific information that may be restricted to the use of certain keys; for example, a field reserved for credit card numbers cannot contain letters.

function key. One of 24 keys on the top row of the 122-key keyboard (or one of 12 keys on the top row of the 102-key keyboard) that is used for operating or adjusting the display station.

H

hexadecimal. A numbering system with a base of 16. Valid digits range from 0 through F, where F represents the highest units position, which is equivalent to decimal 15.

home position. The first input position of the first input field on a display screen.

host system. The main computer and the programming necessary to execute customer jobs. The host system can have numerous display stations or printers attached.

I

image. The characters or attributes shown on the display.

input field. An area on the display in which an operator enters data. Input fields are blank on the display and can be preceded by a prompt.

K

keystroke sequence. The sequence of keys pressed while performing the record function.

M

message line. The line below the separator line on which messages and error codes appear.

multinational character set. The 188/184-character display and printer character set that includes special characters and symbols for different languages.

N

normal image. A display that has light characters on a dark background.

null character. A blank that is displayed as the result of zeros occupying character positions in the buffer.

O

offline. The status of equipment or a processing operation that is not being controlled by a control unit or a processing unit.

online. The status of equipment or a processing operation that is being controlled by a control unit or a processing unit.

operating-status line. The line near the bottom of the display that indicates the operating state of your display station and the system to which it is connected.

operator's manual. A book, produced by the programmers of a system, that contains the procedures for operating the system. Other names for the operator's manual are the system procedures manual, the user's guide, and the job instructions book.

P

power cord. A cord that plugs into an electrical outlet supplying electrical power.

printer. A device that provides printed hard copy output.

program. A series of coded instructions, written for a computer, that performs a specific job; for example, order entry or payroll. The program is stored in the host system and can be accessed by the display station.

R

repeat-action key. A key that, when held fully depressed, causes an action, such as typing a character, to be repeated until the key is released, for example, a typematic key.

reverse video. The character attribute that causes the display of letters, numbers, and symbols as dark characters on a light background.

S

security key lock. A key-operated switch used to control the use of the keyboard and/or data communications operations.

sign-on. A log-on procedure performed at a display station. The procedure can include entering the sign-on command, a password, or other user-specified information.

system. See **host system**

T

terminator switch. A switch that is used to terminate the communication of the last workstation. (The 3477 does not require a terminator switch.)

twinaxial cable. A cable made of two twisted wires inside a shield.

typematic keys. Keyboard keys that repeat their function when pressed and held down.

W

workstation. A display station or printer.

workstation address. The characters or codes that identify a specific workstation in a cable-thru arrangement.

workstation controller. The controlling device that coordinates workstation operation with system operation. Synonymous with *control unit*.

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


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
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
