New Supercomputer offers more power for computer-based research

University of Queensland researchers now have access to a new supercomputer which is the most powerful machine in the Southern Hemisphere.

The University of Queensland, along with six other Queensland universities in a consortium called the Queensland Parallel Supercomputer Facility (QPSF), has purchased an *IBM SP2 Massively Parallel Processor Supercomputer*.

The large memory and net computational power of this supercomputer means that if your program can be converted to run on the SP2, you will be able to solve bigger problems, or be able to solve your current complex problems more quickly.

For those interested in technical details, the SP2 has 22 nodes, 5.8 Gflop aggregate peak performance, 2.8 Gbytes of aggregate memory, and a total of 62 Gbytes of disk storage. Bigger SP2 systems can have up to 128 nodes. Supported programming environments include PVM and Linda.

The SP2 supercomputer has been funded with a grant from the Australian Research Council and contributions from the seven Universities. It will be housed at Griffith University's Nathan campus.

- Windows-compatible mouse strongly recommended.
- Math coprocessor strongly recommended.
