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Dial-in Access Continually Improving

When Prentice introduced Dial-in Access to UQnet we knew it would be a popular service, but no-one anticipated the demand would be so great!

To cope with the large number of clients using the Dial-in Access service, a new modem bank with 31 modems is presently being installed at Prentice. This is in addition to the existing 45 modems. This significant increase to the service should minimise the current congestion problems.

The new modem bank follows the new Annex2 terminal server installed in November, as advertised in the last Bulletin. Some clients will notice minor changes when they dial-in. Collect *FactSheet 15: Accessing UQnet with a Dial-in Modem* from Client Service for full details on how to dial-in. The new Annex2 terminal server allows clients to use SLIP and PPP when they dial-in.

Potential Problems: We have found some modems are not completely compatible with our modem bank. These are: Netcomm E7 and E7F, Banksia 14.4k, Avtek CD960, Maestro 2400 and the latest 14.4k executive, Dynalink 14.4k, and Spirit 14.4k. If you use one of these modems and are having trouble dialing-in, contact Client Service for information on trouble-free connection.


Performance of Network Based Services

Ever wondered why occasionally, you cannot reach some service you require using UQnet, the University's computer network? To give you an idea of the network's performance, we will be publishing availability estimates regularly.

These estimates are daily averages of the availability of a bundle of key network nodes and services. The bundle includes network components managed by the Prentice Centre, as well as services and components outside our control, such as the major AARNet link to Melbourne, provided by Telecom. It includes scheduled downtime for, as an example, maintenance. In meeting your needs, these weighted averages are a measure of the overall performance of the network and its services.

We will also explain some of the problems which may have caused you inconvenience. In this month's graph, the drop in availability in the period 7 - 9 November is due to scheduled downtime for maintenance, and the failure of some off campus links to Herston and PA Hospital. On 21 November, a campus-wide power outage was responsible for network unavailability.

Network services staff at the Prentice Centre routinely use statistics of this type to pinpoint areas of service difficulty and constantly improve the quality of services we offer.
