DMP 2000/Protext Help

In response to Yvonne Kelly's letter, Colin Baker has written in to give some assistance.

To alter the print style within a document all that is required is to select the relevant control code letter as itemised on page 18 of the Protext manual. For example to emphasise the word 'HELP' in bold simply type: CONTROL XbHELP CONTROL Xb - the second CONTROL x switches the bold off. With a couple of exceptions the codes are turned on by the first CONTROL x and off by the second.

The control code letters are shown in inverse video on the screen and although they make the format appear incorrect they will not effect printing. If you find them distracting or want to check the format is correct then they can be toggled on and off using CONTROL V.

The standard set up uses code letters such as b for bold, i for italics, d for double stike, u for underline etc. but there is a facility for you to re-define your own codes and this is done as follows.

From the command mode type SETPRINT. You will then be asked if you wish to set the print options to which you can answer no. You will then be offered the chance to re-define the printer codes, answer yes. The next prompt asks which letter you wish to alter. Type the letter and then you are prompted for the code for on and then off. Do that for all the letters you wish to alter.

GAMES REVIEW: DISC 50

I would like to start by thanking Cascade for sending me 'Disc 50' to review. Disc 50 for those of you who don't know, is a disc containing 50 games. I feel these games may appeal to some of you more than others.

The games as selected via a menu, there are approximately 25 games each side of the disc. The variety of games is very impressive, there are games for the young the old, many are very good. It will take you ages to play all the games and make up your mind which ones are worth playing again.

Compared to 'normal' games the games on the disc may at first appear very basic, but I can assure that out of the 50 games there will be at least ten that you will find enjoyable. It would be impossible to list all the games here but I feel Dynamite deserves a mention.

Dynamite is located on side two of the disc. You play the part of a pilot who has the task of destroying the dam and flooding the valley. There are a couple of hazards to harass your task, for example anti aircraft fire and missiles. In my mind this is one of the most addictive games.

At the other end of the scale comes Hi Low. This game is a complete waste of time, there is no point in wasting electricity to play it. It is yet another copy of 'Play your cards right' where you have to guess whether the next card will be higher or lower than the current one. There is no change in scene to the game. It doesn't matter whether you win or lose, you always end up starting again.

For the price of the disc it is exceptional value for money, when you consider you're only paying 30p each for the games. However as I have already said it will appeal to some more than others. It deserves a look in.

THRUST, Mastertronic, £1.99, All CPC's, Tape.

This game is quite brilliant for the money. It outclasses some £8.95 games thats for sure. As I'm sure some of you know, this game was at the top of the Gallup charts for some weeks, and deservidly so, never has good software been so cheap.

As the game loads in some quite pleasant music is played, but this does not slow down the loading process, because the program plays the music and loads the game at the same time, thus taking the bordon out of loading from tape.

The game itself is easy to understand, but not so easy to do. The first few screens are easy enough to overcome with a little practise, but after them it gets unbelievably tough. With such hazards as the reactor which needs to be damaged is a long way under ground. The reason this is so anoying is the fact that the capsule that you have to retrieve has to be flown into space before the reactor blows up (10 seconds). There are gun turrets around the place, but it is controlling the space ship which will probably kill you and not the guns as they are very slow.

Another nice feature is on screen 7 reverse gravity comes into operation. This is totaly freeky and completely throws your concentration off if you have never been on those particular screens before.

On screen 14 a real test is waiting for the budding pilot, invisable scenery. The screen is in fact the first screen again, but you cannot see it until you press fire. Pressing fire however reduces your fuel at an uncomfortable rate.

All in all this game is brilliant and anyone who won't spend £1.99 for a game such as this needs his/her head testing.

A good way to get around never seeing those screens before is to cheat. just press 2, 5, 8 (on the numeric key pad) , UP, and ESC and you are through to the next screen with a bonus, good eh!

BROTHER M-1109 PRINTER

Brother, £169.00, Connectable to all CPC's.

The Brother M-1109 printer is a new addition to the Brother range of quality printers, infact one popular magazine is quoted as saying that 'There are two types of printers - Brothers and the rest'.

The M-1109 has ports for Centronics parallel and RS-232C connections. Unfortunately the connector cables do not come with the printer, so some shopping around is required before buying the correct lead for approx. £6.00.

The printer is capable of 100 cps which is easily enough for home and business use. In NLQ however it decreases to only 25 cps but the quality from it is very good for a dot matrix printer.

The printer has a nice visual effect unlike some ugly big thing that needs a table all of its own. The pads on the top are On line and Line feed, NLQ is easily activated by pressing the LF pad while the printer is on line.

The printer has fourteen different character sets including sets for ten different countries. It also has italics, condensed and all the other usual features found in quality printers.

The M-1109 can accept cut sheets or fanfold paper and comes with the pin-feed mechanism at no extra cost (unlike quite a few printers on the market at the moment)

The documentation with the printer gives all the required information about the specifications, a vast improvement on the Brother HR-5 printer manual which might as well not exist at all.

This printer has got to be one of the best buys on the market at the moment. What with its excellent print quality and the affordability it comes out top in my books.

INTRODUCTION TO COMPUTING

Page 8

As many of you have written in saying you only have a limited knowledge of BASIC computer programming, we have decided to include in our newsletters an introduction to programming. We are starting right from scratch, as though you never programmed before, this will avoid problems in later sections.

First of all what is the purpose of a computer program? Well without a program of some sort the computer will just sit there looking stupid. The computer of course has its own program in the ROM called the operating system. This operating system contains all the basic commands you will need. The program you will type tells the computer to perform a task eg. clear the screen.

The 'CLS' command clears the screen and positions the cursor at the top of the screen, the screen is now ready to display anything you care to print (the CLS command is not required for any reason except to tidy the screen up).

Once the screen is cleared, how do you print on it? The command used in this situation is PRINT "Text to be displayed". PRINT on its own will move the cursor down one space.

Eg. PRINT "United Amstrad User Group"

This will print 'United Amstrad User Group' on the screen.

INPUT is a command which allows the computer to ask questions for further reference eg.

```
10 INPUT "What is your name ";name$  
20 PRINT "HELLO "name$
```

This will store the name entered in the variable 'name\$' and then say hello to that person. A variable can be in two forms basic forms :-

- 1) a Numeric variable
- 2) an Alfa-numeric variable

A numeric, as the name suggests is a variable in which only numbers for addition etc. The Alfa-numeric variable can store letters etc. The Alfa-numeric variables must be followed by a '\$' eg. name\$ Numeric variables are split up in to two groups

- 1) Decimal
- 2) Integer

Integer can only store whole or real numbers, where as decimal can store any kind of number.
